Your letter has been delayed in the post. I am sorry to find you have arrived at such a conclusion as to your having a States in this locality & I cannot understand ~~on~~ what can have caused you to think so as I have not said a single word to this effect. As to giving

Mr Harvey notice to quit, in the letter you wrote me on the subject there is not a word to this effect but even if I had intentions it was no use to give notice as Mr H. is entitled to 12 months notice ending on March the 25th in my year as I told you on Friday the proper time to give him notice will be in March next intended to inform Mr Harvey the first time I see him that I have intentions

to do this as you told me on Tuesday
but I must give him notice.

The House adjoining the offices
is strictly speaking the Agents
House & which many years ago
Mr. Harvey lived in, after his
removal to Stinton my Father
lived here for about 25 years
until his death - I live in a
very small House at Newton
it belongs to a farm which I
now occupy but in the year 1850

in consequence of a House that
was always used for an Agent's
Residence & Clerk being sent
down this was given up for the
purpose t. There since occupied

rent was paid for it. I dare
say you will recollect that Mr.
Harvey did not pay a cent full
rent until you owned the property.
